New Delhi is set to host one of the most significant water events in Asia this year. India International Water Week 2026, scheduled during 22 to 26 September at Bharat Mandapam, shall bring together policymakers, researchers, industry leaders, and communities from across the globe, to address one of the defining challenges of our time - Climate Resilient Water Management.

Conceptualised in 2012 as India Water Week, the event has grown over eight editions into a premier global platform addressing water challenges, promoting sustainable development, and showcasing innovative solutions. For its ninth edition, it takes on a new name - India International Water Week, reflecting both its expanded global ambit, as well as India's growing leadership in water governance.

Conference, Exhibition, and More

IIWW 2026 is being organised by the Ministry of Jal Shakti, Government of India, as a multi-disciplinary conference with a parallel running exhibition, bringing together ideas, technologies, and solutions focused on the entire gamut of water issues, with special focus on climate resilient water management. It is designed as a platform for action: converging the think-tanks, academia, policy makers as well as those who deliver solutions on the ground.

The event is expected to draw over 5,000 delegates from around the globe, and the exhibition is spread over a state-of-the-art space covering 7,000 square metres, co-located with the conference halls at Bharat Mandapam.

Who Should Attend

IIWW 2026 is open to global decision - makers, politicians, researchers, experts, planners, innovators, and students, making it as relevant to a first-time researcher presenting a paper, as to a minister setting national water policy. Knowledge partners expected to join the event include the International Commission on Irrigation and Drainage (ICID), the World Bank, ADB, India Water Foundation, the Council on Energy, Environment and Water (CEEW), and the Indian Chamber of Commerce.
